



#### OWNER'S MANUAL

This manual has been prepared to acquaint you with the operation and maintenance of your JAYCO tent camper. Please read it carefully and follow its recommendations to assure the most enjoyable and trouble-free operation of your camper. Listed on this and the following pages are subjects that deserve your special attention.



#### TO OPEN FOR CAMPING: -

- 1. Release all four corner latches.
- 2. Turn winch handle until gauge cable in the right front corner appears fairly tight.
- 3. Drop rear jacks into down position and level trailer.
- 4. Slide end bunks out ¾ of the way, set up end bunk bows, bring canvas over the bows, pull bunks out and insert bunk support poles under the bunk. Fasten shock cord around cord holders under the bunk.
- 5. Enter trailer and lower the screen into position. Raise the screen door against spring tension in the top most panel and position screen door "U" channel over entrance door and black vinyl posts over holes. Now release pressure and allow screen door to drop into place. Secure top panel, inside of roof, by turning twist locks. Insert canvas into door frame extrusion. After door is in place, lower roof enough to put a slight amount of weight on the door frame.

TO CLOSE TRAILER: Reverse above 5 proceedings.


NOTE - After roof is latched, put slight pressure on lift system with (A).

By turning the crank cable (B) is wrapped on the winch spool (A) pulling cables (S,T,U,V) which are anchored to a block within the floor tracks (O,P,Q,R) thus forcing pushrods thru the curved pushrod tracks (G,H,I,J) into corner posts (K,L,M,N) which raise the roof.

ROOF IN CLOSED POSITION: Position of flexible pushrod in the closed position is between X & X.

- D. Adjustable eyebolts
- C. Cable mounting block
- E. Pulley and bracket

ROOF IN RAISED POSITION: To service lift system, place a support between point A & B, Jayeagle, Jayrobin, Jayking, 42", Jaythrush and Jayswift, 48".

Position of pushrod in open position is between X and X.

- L. Telescoping square steel tube
- P. Pushrod housing (square steel tube)
- J. Curved pushrod track

ROOF LATCHES: The roof corner latches are adjustable for more or less tension. Turn the clamp screw to tighten or loosen as is needed.

FRONT & REAR JACKS: The front dolly jack should be completely raised while traveling. Dolly wheel must be removed. This may be done by giving the wheel a quarter turn to the indentation slot.

Rear leveling jacks recessed under the frame of the camper at the rear corners. To swing the jacks into operating position, reach under the camper, grasp the jack body and push away from you. Then pivot the jack down and allow it to spring into locked position. (To return to travel position, pull down on the jack and pivot it back under the camper). Slide the jack foot to ground level and take jack handle, flat end, insert thru jack, applying pressure downward to raise. To release, insert jack foot into catch and raise.

CANVAS: Sometimes dirt can be removed with a dry soft bristle brush, or use warm, mild soapy water to clean canvas. Apply with a damp cloth or sponge. Rinse with cool water and allow to dry thoroughly. (Harsh detergents or solvents will remove water repellency). Be sure that canvas is dry for closed trailer storage, or when traveling, do not have trailer closed with damp canvas for more than 24 hours, because mildew will develop and cause the canvas to rot.

VINYL: The white vinyl ends are the same material as convertible car tops, and can be washed likewise. The clear vinyl windows need to be cleaned with a soft cloth to keep from scratching the soft material.

VENTILATION: Certain weather and atmospheric conditions, i.e. (high humidity, warm inside tent temperatures and low outside temperatures), will cause the vinyl portions of the tent to sweat. This condition can be overcome by unzipping the windows and providing moderate ventilation.

UPHOLSTERY: This fabric meets the code 302 fire retardant standard.

The cushion covers and draperies are made of high quality fabric which is treated with "Scotchgard". To keep them at their best, vacuum, brush, or blot away loose dirt, spills and stains before they become embedded and more difficult to remove. DO NOT remove the covers from the cushions. DO NOT dry-clean or wash by hand or machine. The vinyl side of the cushions may be cleaned with a foam, vinyl cleaner or hand scrubbed with water and a detergent

HITCH: (2" ball) Be sure that the coupler tongue is properly latched under the ball, and not only sitting on top of the ball. Also, have some spring tension on the latch, which can be adjusted by turning the nut on underside of coupler.

NEW RUB-R-RIDE - SUSPENSION SYSTEM: There is no maintenance to the axle. A step is no longer necessary with the RUB-R-RIDE axle.

TABLES: To convert into beds, fold the support leg under the table top, raise the table top until the wall fastening disengages and place table between the seats on the ledges provided.

WATER SYSTEM: Fill the tank through the cup-shaped receptacle outside the camper. Water in the tank is pumped into the sink with a fump pump, except when equipped with a 12 volt electric pump. When equipped with an electric pump, the fump pump comes equipped with a built-in 12 volt pump switch. Pull handle up to activate pump. Be sure 12 volt pump is connected to a 12 volt power supply. Drain 12 volt water pump to prevent freeze damage. Standard Finch model has no water system.

CITY WATER HOOK-UP: Attach hose to the connection on the outside of the camper, and then use the faucet.

ICE BOX: Place ice in the top tray, and a small tube will drain the melted ice water outside of camper.

110 VOLT ELECTRICAL SYSTEM: This is a 3-wire manual reset breaker system with the standard electrical color code as follows: Black/hot, White/neutral, Bare wire/ground. The electrical box is located in the front left bunk. This is typical of the following models: Cardinal, King, Swift, Eagle, Hawk, Robin, Thrush and Finch Deluxe.

12 VOLT POWER CONVERTER SYSTEM: The power converter is supplied with 110 volts through one of the manual reset breakers. The power converter supplies power for the ceiling light and the water pump. The Cardinal and the Finch models have no power converter.

**BATTERY PACK SYSTEM:** The Cardinal is equipped with a battery pack to operate the water pump and the ceiling lights. The Cardinal comes equipped with a 2 amp charger.

LP GAS SYSTEM: The tubing and connections were checked at the factory with LP gas, but, it would be wise to re-check the connections after installing the LP gas bottle. Use a soap solution around the joints to check for leaks. The Standard Finch has no gas system.

EXTERIOR ALUMINUM: Can be cleaned and waxed, same as any automobile finish.

LOADING: Be certain to load within safe load capacity limits. Too light of a tongue weight will cause trailers to sway while towing.

WIRING CODE: White - Ground

Green - Right turn signal
Red - Left turn signal
Brown - Clearance lights
Black - 12-volt interior light
Yellow - Back-up light

RUNNING GEAR: Check tire inflation.

 $A. = 18/850 \times 8$  (P.S.I. -45) Finch only

B.  $-20.5/800 \times 10$  (P.S.I. -50)

Check wheel lug bolts to be sure that they are tight.

Check wheel bearings to see if they are properly lubricated.

Check axle mounting bolts and nuts.

Be sure to check every item after the first 500 miles and after every 1000 miles, or twice during the season.

CHANGE TIRE: While wheel is on ground, loosen wheel lugs, one at a time, driving forward each time the lugs are on the lower side. Turn front jacks down as far as you can, then lower rear jacks as far as you can, next turn front jack as high as possible. This will lift the wheels from the ground. Wheels need to be removed by sliding the bottom side of wheels towards the center of the trailer instead of away from the trailer.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR SANITIZING PORTABLE WATER SYSTEMS OF RECREATIONAL VEHICLES: To assure complete sanitation of your portable water system, it is recommended that the following procedures be followed on a new system, one that has not been used for a period of time, or one that may have become contaminated:

- 1. Prepare a chlorine solution by using one gallon of water and \( \frac{1}{4} \) cup of Chlorox or Purex household bleach (5% sodium hypochlorite solution). Pour one gallon of this solution into the tank for each 15 gallons of tank capacity.
- 2. Complete filling of tank with fresh water. Open each faucet and drain cock until all air has been released from the pipes and the entire system is filled.
- 3. Allow to stand for three hours.
- 4. Drain and flush with potable fresh water.
- To remove any excessive chlorine taste or odor which may remain, prepare a solution of one quart of vinegar to five gallons of water and allow this solution to agitate in the tank for several days by vehicle motion.
- 6. Drain tank and again flush with potable water.
